University of Vienna, Main Building



University of Vienna, main building
A-1010, Universitätsring 1


Located within Vienna's historic centre, directly on Vienna's Ringstrasse boulevard, the Main Building of the University of Vienna is easy to reach.

The building, designed by Heinrich Ferstel, was built in Italian Renaissance style and was inaugurated in 1884. In the heart of the Main Building is the green Arcaded Courtyard. In the middle of the Courtyard, you can find the Castalia fountain, which is surrounded by the Arcaded Courtyard's walkways with their numerous busts and monuments.

Ceremonial hall area

When you enter the Main Building through the main entrance, you find yourself in the columned hall of the Aula. Via the left-hand and right-hand atria you reach the two wings of the Main Building of the University as well as the Arcaded Courtyard.

The covered Arcades with their famous busts and plaques are perfect for exhibitions and catering areas.

Via two main staircases you reach the ceremonial hall area of the University of Vienna. This impressive area includes the Main Ceremonial Hall (Großer Festsaal), the Small Ceremonial Hall (Kleiner Festsaal), the Senate Hall (Senatssaal) as well as two cloakrooms and octagons.

University of Vienna, Lecture Halls



Auditorium Maximum

Several event rooms as well as a wide range of lecture halls offering a unique and historical university setting are available for events during periods when there are no classes or exams.

Particularly noteworthy is the Auditorium Maximum, which is the largest lecture hall in Austria, with a capacity of 750 people.

Lecture halls

All centrally managed course rooms are equipped with projectors, allowing you to project the screen of the presenter's PC and – if required – of a laptop onto the wall. You can switch back and forth between the stationary computer and your laptop. Instructions for use are available at the class room.

Every centrally managed course room is equipped with a HDMI port and a VGA port to connect personal laptops to the system.

There is a stationary PC at every centrally managed course room.

By default, these rooms are equipped with a handheld microphone and a headset microphone.

Kunsthistorisches Museum



The Kunsthistorisches Museum is one of the most impressive museum buildings of the nineteenth century. The impressive Entrance Hall leads to a series of wonderfully decorated rooms. This area offers access to the Egyptian and Near Eastern Collection and to the Kunstkammer. The Main Staircase and the Cupola Hall combine baroque decorative features to one of the most precious interior rooms of all European museum architecture. The original ceiling and wall paintings are amongst others by Mihály von Munkácsy, Hans Makart and Gustav Klimt.

Heldenberg, Neolithic Village

Heldenberg is located near Hollabrunn in Lower Austria and offers an extensive entertainment and excursion program including the reconstruction of a ring ditch and several buildings from the Middle Neolithic Lengyel culture. The area surrounding Heldenberg was settled as far back as the Early Stone Age. For the exhibition a full-size ring ditch and a settlement section with four buildings was reconstructed.


The Archaeological Park Carnuntum in the east of Austria brings Roman history to life.
